During his different postings, he conceptualized various innovative schemes and implemented them throughout the State. These innovative schemes brought tremendous change in the lives of people. - e-mahabhumi 2010: The programme for comprehensive modernization and management of land records in Maharashtra by using modern technology.

Mr Dalvi conceptualized and successfully implemented the 'Zero Pendency and Daily Disposal' project for citizen-centric and vibrant governance. General Administration Department of Maharashtra Govt has issued a GR on 15/02/2018 and adopted zero pendency system in all government and semi-government offices of the state.

Mr. Dalvi has authored 'Zero Pendency and Daily Disposal', a book on administration which is referred by government and private organizations as a manual for providing prompt and responsive governance to citizens.

Under his able guidance and leadership, he has developed native village **Nidhal in Satara district** as one of the Modern Villages of India. He is a rare example of officers who dedicated themselves to the development of their village incessantly for 35 years from date of entry into the government service till the date of retirement and even beyond. Nidhal Village has also been felicitated with many awards at the National and State levels at the hands of Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Governor of Maharashtra, and the President of India.

After retirement, Mr. Dalvi has founded the 'SATV Foundation' with a focus on Rural Development. Foundation is currently working on the overall development of 30 villages in Maharashtra. These villages are being developed under Mr Dalvi's supervision and advice.
